2006 Midwest Gathering of the Artists

On September 8 and 9, 2006, the 29th annual Midwest Gathering of the Artists http://www.4statearts.com/organizations/mga/mga2006.html was held at the Memorial Hall in Carthage, Missouri. On Friday, September 8, there was an awards presentation to the participating artists followed by an auction of a new art work by each of the artists. Lowell's magnificent auction piece, entitled "King Me", was a hot item during the auction, selling for over \$3,500. 
Red Oak II Update



The book is in progress and Snow Folks color prints and greeting cards are available now. The other book will be based on The Dalton Gang – up to their old antics again:


